Meet the Judges



National Ayrshire Show & Guernsey Judge – Peter Berresford

Peter runs the 140-cow Heydale Ayrshire herd 1,000 feet up in the Derbyshire Peak District. He has judged at most major shows in the UK, including AgriScot, Royal Highland, Dairy Event, Royal Welsh, South West Dairy Show, Great Yorkshire, ABAB Calf Show, along with the Finnish Winter Show, and he has also been

ring man at the RAWF in Toronto. The Heydale Herd has had five All-Britain winners and numerous show winners.



National Brown Swiss Show Judge – Andrew Cope

Andy, of the Huddlesford herd in Staffordshire, is on the Brown Swiss, Holstein UK and EHRC judging panels and has a wealth of experience having judged at the Danish, Hungarian and Irish National Shows along with a regional show in Spain and many shows in the UK including the Brown Swiss classes at the

ABAB Calf Show and interbreeds at the Royal Cornwall Show, Royal Welsh Show and Royal Norfolk Show. Andy and his family have enjoyed huge success over the years, winning Champion Holstein three times at the Royal Show and four times at the Dairy Events, with families such as Flo, Melody, Kitty and Betsy, all of whom have gone on to leave outstanding progeny in many herds across the country.



National Dairy Shorthorn Show Judge – Kylie Preisinger

Kylie grew up with Milking Shorthorns in Vermont (USA) and is the 4th generation involved with the Green Acres prefix. Kylie served as a Director for 12 years on the Board of Directors for the American Milking Shorthorn Society, where she spent much of her time focused on increasing genetic imports

and exports of Dairy/Milking Shorthorns, travelling to see cattle in Australia, Canada and the UK. Now in the UK, due to her husband's military posting in Gloucestershire, Kylie is teaching Agriculture at Hartpury College, focusing on Dairy Production for final-year students.



The National Holstein Show Judge – David Hodgson

David travels from the Wormanby Herd in Burghby-Sands, five miles west of Carlisle where he farms 340 acres with his wife Louise and parents Harry and Margaret. David and Louise have two children, Matthew and Rosie.

There are several prolific cow families in the Wormanby herd, with the Mahalas & Gloriettes being two, which amount to a quarter of the total herd of 245. Wormanby Holsteins has developed into one of the top herds in the UK, winning the title of Holstein UK Premier Herd in 2015 and qualifying as a Master Breeder in 2009 and 2019. The Hodgson family were awarded the title of Holstein UK Premier Breeder at UK Dairy Day 2024 and Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor at UK Dairy Expo 2025.

Over the last few years, David has been privileged to have judged the Royal Highland Show, Balmoral Show, the Royal Welsh Show, the All Ireland Calf Show and the All Breeds All Britain Calf Show.



Jersey Judge – Hefyn Wilson

Hefyn and his family farm at Tregibby Farm in Cardigan, where they milk 90 Holsteins and Jerseys, along with 140 youngstock under the Tregibby prefix. Hefyn is a member of the Jersey UK and Holstein UK national judging panels and the EHRC judging panel. He has judged Jerseys at the Great Yorkshire, Bath &

West, Westmorland and Anglesey Shows. He has also judged four breeds at the ABAB Calf Show. Across the water, Hefyn has judged at Emerald Expo and Charleville Show in the Republic of Ireland and the Jersey Island Autumn Show.

UK DAIRY DAY INFORMATION & REGULATIONS

Please observe the following rules for your safety, the smooth running of the show and the enjoyment of all who visit in any capacity.

Show Opening Times

Wednesday 10th September 2025 - 8.00am to 5.30pm

1. Arrival & Departure

Dairy cattle may be admitted on to the site after 3pm on Sunday 7th September until 3pm on Tuesday 9th September. Cattle may leave after the end of the show from 17.30 and, in all instances, must be removed from the site by 8am the following day.

2. Entry Fees

There will be a non-refundable entry fee of £50.00 per animal entered, payable at the time of submitting a cattle entry form.

3. Stall Reservations

A fully refundable deposit of £50.00 per stall will be required at the time of booking stalls. Where possible an additional stall will be allocated to each exhibitor free of charge for feed and tack to be stored. Please do not include this in your total.

The stalling deposit will be refunded for occupied stalls. However, each stall that is booked but remains unoccupied by cattle will lose their deposit.

4. Substitutes

Substitute entries will be accepted; please ensure you notify the Cattle Office immediately.

5. Prize Money

Prize money will be distributed as follows in each class:

Rosettes will be awarded down to 10th place, plus tail ribbons for Best Udder and Exhibitor Bred in each class. Championship Sashes will be awarded to each Senior Breed Champion.

A prize of £100.00 will be given to both the Best Presented Cattle Line and the Best Tidy Line, both of which will be judged and announced on show day.

Prize money will be paid by BACS direct to the bank account details provided on the stall booking form or you can have it credited to your Holstein UK/CIS account.

6. Exhibitor Wristbands

All livestock exhibitors will be required to wear identification wristbands at all times whilst on site; wristbands will allow 24 hour access to the livestock hall and 15% discount at the canteen located upstairs in the Ironbridge Suite on show day. Wristband allocation is unlimited.

7. Accommodation

All exhibitors will be required to book their own accommodation;
we recommend you do this early as rooms tend to get booked up, especially on the Tuesday evening.

Please book direct with all hotels. All are within a 5 minute walk of the exhibition halls.

Unfortunately, we are unable to offer any facilities on site for overnight stays, caravans or camping.

8. Stockman's Catering

Complimentary breakfast rolls (one voucher per cow/per morning) and unlimited tea & coffee will be provided in the run up to the show in Hall 3 (the cattle hall).

Exhibitors are forbidden to bring any cooking equipment (i.e. gas stoves, BBQ's and microwaves) on to the site.

UK Dairy Day has secured a 15% discount on food from the canteen in the Ironbridge Suite at the top of the stairs from the foyer with a stockman's wristband on show day.

9. Dress

Leaders must wear society uniform whilst in the ring.

10. Bedding

Straw will be provided on arrival and will be available for exhibitors throughout the event. Sawdust, fodder and haylage will NOT be provided and will NOT be available to buy on site.

Please note - deliveries of the above must be organised with the UK Dairy Day team before its arrival.

11. Ventilation

The show has invested in a ventilation system for Hall 3. Exhibitors will NOT be permitted to erect their own fan.

12. Acceptance of Entries

The show reserves the right to refuse any entry without providing reasons. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors/teams to ensure stall bookings are posted well in advance of the closing date. Closing dates are final and will be strictly enforced, entries received after the closing date cannot be guaranteed.

13. Cancellation or Combining of Classes

The show reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes if it is decided that there are insufficient entries or exhibitors. If a breed is unable to attract 10 or more stall bookings, classes may be cancelled however all stall booking fees will be refunded in these circumstances.

14. Checking of Entry Details

Exhibitors/teams are entirely responsible for the eligibility of their animals for the classes entered and should check that all details are complete and accurate before submission.

15. Competitor/Exhibitor Declaration

By completing the entry form (in any section), you agree to abide by the regulations of the UK Dairy Day. Any exhibitors/team that break

any of the show rules or use unfair means to win a prize will forfeit all prizes and prize money and may be banned from attending future shows.

16. Passports

All animals must be accompanied by their BCMS passports and double tagged with official UK Ear Tags.

17. Claims

Holstein UK, its officers or agents (whether negligent or not) shall not be liable for any claims of losses or damages by an exhibitor/team in relation to the show.

18. Rules and Regulations

The ruling of the show management in relation to any matters concerning the event shall be final and binding to all concerned. At any one time, they have the powers to reject an unsuitable animal. Full rules can be found in Appendix 1.

19. Veterinary Inspection

All cattle will be subject to veterinary inspection at the discretion of the show management and show veterinary officer. Any treatment by the vet will be recharged to the exhibitor.

20. Ringworm

All cattle showing signs of ringworm must have a veterinary certificate showing that they have been treated for at least two weeks prior to the show, and the lesions must be inactive and have hair growing on them. Any animal not adhering to this rule with ringworm lesions will not be allowed into the show.

21. Udder Scanning

Udder scanning will be carried out for all animals prior to entering the ring. Please refer to Appendix 2.

22. Milking

Milking buckets are not provided by the show. If an exhibitor can not obtain a milking bucket please contact the Cattle Office before arrival and we will try and make provisions.

23. Bovine Tuberculosis Regulations

The show organiser requires that ALL cattle attending the event are pre-movement tested despite the location of their holding of origin. The pre-movement test is valid for 60 days from the date of injection NOT the date of reading. Please be aware of this before attending any shows and book your test(s) in plenty of time.

When attending UK Dairy Day 2025 you will need to TB test on the 13th July (at the earliest) to ensure you are within the 60-day period when departing the showground on Thursday 11th September.

All exhibitors are required to supply a copy of their TB certificate to the Show Office PRIOR to arrival at the venue. Copies must be emailed to cattleoffice@ukdairyday.co.uk

24. Complaints Procedure

Complaints must be given in writing and handed into the show office.

25. Red & White Holstein Animals

All Holstein animals that are Red & White in colour on the day of the show will only be permitted to enter the Red & White classes.

26. BVD

Every animal entered also needs to either reside in a herd accredited free of BVD by a CHECS approved cattle health scheme or, at any time in its life, have been tested individually on a blood, milk or tissue sample for evidence of the BVD virus, with a negative result.

Exhibitors will be required to show proof of either the accredited BVD free status of the animal's herd of origin into which it was born or the individual animal's BVD virus negative test result before the event. Copies must be emailed to cattleoffice@ukdairyday.co.uk

27. Rules and Regulations for Showing Dairy Cattle

28. Blue Tongue

We will follow the current Bluetongue control measures at the time of the show and will ask to see the relevant licences if animals require them.
